

Beltug CIO Cabinet – Mission & Scope

1 Background

At Beltug, we aim to break down the barriers companies face when building their digital strategy. The Beltug CIO Cabinet acts as a sounding board to support Beltug in its efforts to build positions on the most pressing issues, and to point out the bottlenecks in legislation.

Sharing knowledge and learning from peers is key for all stakeholders in the digital transformation, also at CIO level. The Beltug CIO Cabinet also acts a platform for CIOs to exchange experiences and best practices on the challenges of the digital transformation.

2 Scope & Mission

The Beltug CIO Cabinet will meet, discuss and make suggestions to Beltug regarding issues, activities and lobbying efforts that can be undertaken in the area of IT operations, digitisation and digital transformation. Topics can extend beyond the national borders of Belgium. The members of the CIO Cabinet will define the topics for discussion and the agendas for their meetings. Beltug will use the findings and suggestions of the CIO Cabinet to inform its members, and to develop new tools, papers, positions, activities when and if relevant.

Organisation of events is not in the scope of this initiative, as that is already part of the regular Beltug activities.

3 Members: who can apply?

They must be Beltug members and are knowledgeable people with a high willingness to share their expertise.

4 Participation

The CIO Cabinet will meet on a regular basis, to be determined by the CIO Cabinet members. CIO Cabinet members are expected to be engaged in the CIO Cabinet and attend the gatherings on a regular basis.

CIO Cabinet members should be willing to host a CIO Cabinet meeting at times, either at the company's offices or elsewhere.

The CIO Cabinet may not be used in any way for commercial purposes.

5 Confidentiality

Meetings will follow the Chatham House Rule: participants are free to use the information received, but neither the identity nor the affiliation of the speaker(s), nor that of any other participant, may be revealed. However, the conclusions of the CIO Cabinet's conversations can be used to share knowledge and best practices with the Beltug community.
